Forecast Examples (page 1)



- Halloween Snowstorm of 2011: Alerted Oct 18 (11 days ahead)
- o Hurricane Sandy Oct 29 2012: Alerted Oct 23 (7 days ahead), on Oct 25 made prediction
 - 'For impact, we believe this storm will make landfall anywhere from Cape May to Long Island (the center of the storm) and drift north-northwestward over our region. This will occur primarily on Monday with that being the worst weather day."
- O <u>Dec 22 & 24 2012 light snow:</u> Alerted Dec 7 (15 days ahead)— "And the week of the 17th up through Christmas Eve will be colder for the Northeast and it appears storm tracks will become more active as well, giving us the possibility of one or maybe two snow chances during that period."
- O <u>Dec 26-27 rain event (1.85" rain / 0.4" snow):</u> Alerted Dec 23 (3 days ahead) "This track allows for possibly enough warm air to pull into our region with this storm to make <u>most of the precipitation for the vast majority of the area to fall as rain and not snow</u>. However, we could see the precip start out as snow, changeover to rain for most of the event, and then back to a wet snow towards the back side | end of the storm."
- <u>Dec 29 snow (1.5" at EWR):</u> Alerted Dec 23 (8 days ahead) "We continue to track a third storm that will impact our area Saturday evening into early Sunday morning. This storm right now appears to have a better shot at track just offshore enough of NJ and Long Island for this to <u>be more of a snow producer and not a rain event</u>."

Forecast Examples (page 2)



- O Big Warm-Up (Jan 8-10, 50 degrees...Jan 14, 58 degrees): Alerted on Jan 3 (7-10 days ahead)- "We are looking at temperatures that will be well above normal for this time of the year from Jan 9th-14th and readings could push into the 50s for highs! (Maybe even one day with temps pushing the 60-degree mark are not out of the realm of possibilities now)."
- Rain Event (Jan 11): Alerted on Jan 3 (8 days ahead) "The next chance for precipitation will come around the 10th-11th and this will most definitely be <u>a rain event</u> with the warm air in place."
- Rain Event (Jan 15-16): Alerted on Jan 9 (6-7 days ahead) "The next few precipitation events will be all rain with the milder weather in place through mid-month."
- Strong cold (Jan 22-26): Alerted on Jan 18 (4-8 days ahead) "The big weather news stories for us the next week will be the ushering in of very cold air next week (Mon-Thu) ..."
- Nor'easter (Feb 8): Alerted Feb 3 (5 days ahead), Alerted Feb 5 "RIGHT NOW WE BELIEVE IT IS SAFE TO MAKE THE CALL THAT A RATHER SIGNIFICANT SNOWSTORM (Nor'easter) WILL BE HITTING AREAS OF NJ AND THE NYC METRO INTO NEW ENGLAND BY THE 2ND HALF OF THE DAY FRIDAY INTO SATURDAY MORNING"
- Over-hyped "SNOWMAGGEDON" storm(Mar 25): Alerted Mar 19 (6 days ahead) —
 "Right now, we DO NOT see ACCUMULATING snows for I-95 corridor itself from DC to NYC and
 Boston...temps probably too warm for it to stick"
