## Weather Outlook

## Smith/Doe Wedding (Apr 19-20)



Weather planning and preparation for your special day.

## Friday, April 19 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ :

Mostly sunny skies throughout the day and evening. Morning begins with temperatures in the low 50 s, rising to around 61 by Noon and a high for the day of 65 by mid-afternoon. Cloud coverage in the afternoon hours will generally be around $30 \%-35 \%$. No precipitation expected ( $0 \%$ ).

Changes from previous forecast: Temperatures with this updates have trended slightly warmer, while there were no changes to the precipitation or cloud coverage forecasts.

## Saturday, April 20 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ :

Clear skies in the morning will lead to increasing clouds as the rest of the day progresses. Morning temperatures in the middle 50 s will increase to around 59 by Noon and the high for the day will be 63 by mid-afternoon. Cloud coverage by 10AM will increase to $40 \%$ and around $75 \%-80 \%$ by 2 PM and the rest of the afternoon. Although there will be cloudier skies by afternoon and evening, we do not see any significant chance for precipitation (only $10 \%$ ). Light winds of $5-10 \mathrm{MPH}$ will increase slightly to $10-15 \mathrm{MPH}$ for the afternoon and early evening hours.

CEREMONY (3PM-4PM): Mostly cloudy skies with temperatures between 61-63. No precipitation.

RECEPTION (5PM-Midnight): Mostly cloudy skies. Temperatures will slowly fall into the upper 50 s by 8 PM and will be around $52-53$ by Midnight. No precipitation.

Changes from previous forecast: High temperatures for the day were a bit lower with today's update, due to an increase in cloudiness.

## Sunday, April 21 ${ }^{\text {st: }}$

Mostly cloudy skies in the morning with temperatures in the low 50s. Clearing skies are expected as the day progresses with partly cloudy skies by midday and the afternoon/evening hours (around $25 \%-30 \%$ coverage). Temperatures will warm into the upper 60 s to around 70 by the afternoon hours with dewpoint temperatures also increasing throughout the day (more summer-like air mass pushes into the region). Southwesterly winds will also pick up by midday and afternoon with $15-25 \mathrm{MPH}$ sustained winds expected, gusting to around $35-40 \mathrm{MPH}$. No threat of precipitation ( $0 \%$ ).

Changes from previous forecast: We increased winds on this update, as well as pushed up high temperatures a few degrees warmer. Cloud coverage was also decreased for afternoon and evening hours.
